Thesis Statement

- The most important sentence in an argumentative essay
- Tells what the author will say about the essay's topic
- Tells the claim, or argument the writer will develop in the body of the essay
- Usually appears in the first paragraph of the essay
- Is supported in the rest of the essay's paragraphs with facts, quotes, evidence, and examples
