## **Organize Argumentative Writing**

- An argumentative essay is intended to convince readers of an author's position or point of view on a subject
- Writers introduce a claim and support that claim with valid reasoning and relevant evidence
- Writers should acknowledge counterclaims
- Writers choose from a number of structures, including logical reasoning, cause and effect, and definition and example.
